## IN RE: AURELIO ARMENTA WAIVER REQUEST

#### **ORDER**

This matter came before the HVACR (Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning, Refrigeration) Board on Wednesday February 13, 2022. The petitioner, Aurelio Armenta, seeks approval for a registrant application for which he is currently ineligible due to prior criminal convictions. The HVACR Board has the authority to waive disqualification of a license based on a criminal conviction if the Board decides that the applicant meets requirements listed in Ark. Code Annotated § 17-3-102(b)(2). Mr. Armenta appeared before the Board via zoom for the hearing.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT:

- 1. The petitioner ("Armenta") is requesting a registrant application from the Board for which he is currently ineligible due to criminal convictions from 2017.
- 2. Armenta appeared before the Board via zoom and testified that he is on track to successfully complete probation on February 17, 2023.
- 3. Armenta also provided a professional letter or recommendation.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

- 1. The board has authority to waive disqualification of a license based on a criminal conviction pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §17-3-102(b)(1).
- 2. A basis upon which a waiver may be granted includes without limitation:

- a. The age at which the offense was committed;
- b. The circumstances surrounding the offense;
- c. The length of time since the offense was committed;
- d. Subsequent work history since the offense was committed;
- e. Employment references since the offense was committed;
- f. Character references since the offense was committed;
- g. Relevance of the offense to the occupational license; and
- h. Other evidence demonstrating that licensure of the applicant does not pose a threat to the health or safety of the public. Ark. Code Ann. §17-3-102(b)(2).
- 3. In the present case, the Board considered the testimony from Armenta and the letter of recommendation.
- 4. The Board was informed of the nature of the criminal convictions and the time which the offenses took place.
- 5. The Board also acknowledged that Armenta would be working under a licensed HVACR employer as a registrant as opposed to working on his own as a licensee.
- 6. The Board voted to grant Armenta's request for a registrant application.

THEREFORE, the Board grants Armenta's request for the HVACR registrant application.
