Ann. § 17-28-304

 Marcus Harold Griggs is subject to a civil money penalty in the amount of \$50.00 pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 17-28-309 and Regulation 9 of the board.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

- Ark. Code Ann. § 17-28-304 has since July 1, 1998 prohibited any person from performing electrical work in the state unless the person is licensed by the Board of Electrical Examiners. Isaac Brewster violated the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. § 17-28-304.
- Regulation 11.6 of the board provides that "No person licensed by the board shall employ unlicensed persons or unregistered apprentices to perform electrical work. . ." Billy Brewster violated the provisions of Regulation 11.6.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Billy Brewster has violated Regulation 11.6 of the board and Isaac Brewster has violated Ark. Code Ann. § 17-28-304, and that this finding may be the basis for progressive discipline pursuant to the rules of the board for a period of two (2) years. No fine is assessed.
