A hearing on the above captioned matter was held before the Arkansas Residential Contractors Committee on March 18, 2026, at the Committee's offices at 4100 Richards Road, North Little Rock, Arkansas.

Respondent, TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC was properly notified and did appear with his attorney Danny Williams. The Committee was represented by Jonathan Hutto, Attorney. Heidi Massey served as Hearing Officer. From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC has undertaken the position of residential contractor as defined in Section 17-25-505, **Home Improvement in Desha, AR.**

2. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC is not licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee.

3. Our office received a complaint from Aliyha Boozer against TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC stating that she had hired him to perform a home improvement project for \$42,600 and TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC abandoned the project prior to completion.

4. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC provided Ms. Boozer with an estimate on his own letterhead to perform the work and was personally paid \$27,610 toward the total price. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC advertises that he acts as a contractor on both his website and his Facebook page.

5. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC was asked by the Committee to estimate the number of days on the project and could not. In the complaint, the homeowner stated that there were approximately 30 days of activity on the project. Based on the testimony and exhibits, the Committee determined that there were 25 days of activity on the project.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 25 days of activity for a total of \$10,000 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE

REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC to prevent them from performing work in violation. TERRANCE OSBORNE, d/b/a THE REAL DEAL OF BATESVILLE LLC shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

Heidi Massey served as Hearing Officer. From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING has undertaken the position of residential contractor as defined in Section 17-25-505, **Home Improvement in West Memphis, AR.**

2. BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING is not licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee.

3. Our office received a complaint from Kimberly Robertson against BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING stating that she had hired him to perform a home improvement project and paid him \$7,000. BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING failed to complete the work and did not return the money. There were 60 days of activity on the project.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 60 days of activity for a total of \$24,000 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING to prevent them from performing work in violation. BERKELEY BOSTON, d/b/a BERKELEY BOSTON PLUMBING shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

A hearing on the above captioned matter was held before the Arkansas Residential Contractors Committee on March 18, 2026, at the Committee's offices at 4100 Richards Road, North Little Rock, Arkansas.

Respondent, DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE was properly notified and did not appear. The Committee was represented by Jonathan Hutto, Attorney. Heidi Massey served as Hearing Officer. From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE is licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee with several home improvement specialties.
2. On January 22, 2025, the Committee found DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE in violation for working without a license and issued a penalty in the amount of \$6,000. The contractor agreed to make monthly payments on the penalty and the Committee allowed him to obtain a home improvement license.
3. DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE stopped making payments on the penalty and has been ignoring communication about the payment on the penalty. This failure to pay the penalty is misconduct.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE is guilty of violating Section 17-25-510(c) misconduct in the contractors business.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that the license of DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE is revoked for misconduct. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE to prevent them from performing work in violation. DERRICK HANNAH, d/b/a TWO HANDS HANDYMAN SERVICE shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

2. ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION is not licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee.
3. Our office received a complaint from Jerry Piercy against ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION stating that he was hired to build a tiny home for \$78,000 and paid \$19,500 toward that total. ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION dug the footers but no concrete was poured and no other work was ever performed. There were 28 days of activity on the project.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 28 days of activity for a total of \$11,200 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION to prevent them from performing work in violation. ROBERT LEVIS, d/b/a LEVIS CONSTRUCTION shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. has undertaken the position of residential contractor as defined in Section 17-25-505, **New Residence in Eureka Springs, AR.**
2. ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. is not licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee. ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. had been licensed as a residential builder but that license was revoked by the Committee on January 22, 2025.
3. ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. entered into a contract on April 3, 2025, with Tom Westervelt to build a new residence for \$698,761. There were issues with the project including ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. failing to pay subcontractor resulting in Mr. Westervelt having to pay twice for the work. Mr. Westervelt eventually fired ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. from the project. There were 180 days of activity on the project.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 180 days of activity for a total of \$72,000 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. to prevent them from performing work in violation. ARTISAN DESIGN & CONSTRUCT, INC. shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

FINDINGS OF FACT


1. INFINITE ROOFING LLC is licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee with a residential roofer registration.
2. Our office received a complaint from Anthony Pekowski, d/b/a New Farm Solar against INFINITE ROOFING LLC stating that they had been hired to remove and reinstall solar panels on a roof project being performed by INFINITE ROOFING LLC. He was to be paid \$9,890 for the work but was not paid as agreed and to date has still not received full payment.
3. On February 28, 2025, the Contractors Licensing Board approved a settlement agreement for INFINITE ROOFING LLC in the amount of \$10,400 reduced to \$4,000 if it applied for a commercial roofing license. INFINITE ROOFING LLC failed to apply for the commercial license and has only made sporadic payments toward the penalty.
4. After this testimony and evidence was presented, INFINITE ROOFING LLC voluntarily surrendered their residential roofing registration.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously to accept the surrender of the registration. INFINITE ROOFING LLC shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

The only work that was performed was the home was partially framed before CHARLES LADUKE, d/b/a LADUKE'S CORNERSTONE abandoned the project and refused to return or refund any money. There were 30 days of activity on the project.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


CHARLES LADUKE, d/b/a LADUKE'S CORNERSTONE is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that CHARLES LADUKE, d/b/a LADUKE'S CORNERSTONE shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 30 days of activity for a total of \$12,000 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against CHARLES LADUKE, d/b/a LADUKE'S CORNERSTONE to prevent them from performing work in violation. CHARLES LADUKE, d/b/a LADUKE'S CORNERSTONE shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. Long against CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION stating that he had hired him to build a new residence for \$98,500 and had paid him \$66,300 toward the project. The project was never begun and the only thing performed was 4 boards being laid in a square. CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION abandoned the project and refused to refund the money. There were 50 days of activity on the project.
4. CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION has two previous violations, one of which remains unpaid.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.

ORDER

The Committee voted unanimously that CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 50 days of activity for a total of \$20,000 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION to prevent them from performing work in violation. CLAY LEWALLEN, d/b/a TWO BROTHERS CONSTRUCTION shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee.
