BEFORE THE ARKANSAS BOARD OF LICENSURE FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND PROFESSIONAL SURVEYORS

Case #2006-13, in the matter of Michael Marlar:

COMPLAINT

The Arkansas Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Professional Surveyors (hereinafter "the Board") registered a complaint on December 12, 2006, charging Michael P. Marlar (AR-PS #1240, hereinafter "Marlar") with gross negligence and/or incompetence in the practice of surveying, in violation of Arkansas Code Annotated §17-48-102.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Marlar was retained to survey the Complainant's property.
- 2. The resulting survey indicated an overlap with the adjoining property holder.
- 3. The State Surveyor reviewed the survey and found no evidence of wrongdoing on the part of Marlar. He was of the opinion the fault lay with an ambiguous property description.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Upon review of the evidence in its possession, the Board finds Marlar's actions as described in the Findings of Fact do not constitute a violation of the statutes or rules governing the Arkansas Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Professional Surveyors.

ORDER

Based on these findings, the complaint against Marlar is dismissed without further action by the Board.
