**FINDINGS OF FACT,  
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER**

A hearing on the above captioned matter was held before the Arkansas Residential Contractors Committee on November 12, 2025, at the Committee's offices at 4100 Richards Road, North Little Rock, Arkansas.

Respondent, AURLIEAN MITCHELL was properly notified by personal service and did appear by Zoom. The Committee was represented by Jonathan Hutto, Attorney. Heidi Massey served as Hearing Officer. From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. AURLIEAN MITCHELL has undertaken the position of residential contractor as defined in Section 17-25-505, **Various Projects in Various Locations, AR.**
2. AURLIEAN MITCHELL is not licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee.
3. Our office received a complaint from Charles and Janice Thompson against AURLIEAN MITCHELL stating that they had hired him to perform a home improvement project and paid him \$5,434. The workmanship was very poor and the contractor would not make corrections.
4. Our office received a complaint from Brenda Gaddy against AURLIEAN MITCHELL stating that she had paid him \$10,000 on a \$19,000 home improvement project and no work was ever done and no money was ever returned.
5. Our office received a complaint from Melanie Dumas against AURLIEAN MITCHELL stating that she had hired AURLIEAN MITCHELL to perform a home improvement project in the amount of \$35,000. She paid \$17,949 but the contractor abandoned the project prior to completion and refused to refund any money.
6. There were a total of 67 days of activity on these three projects.
7. AURLIEAN MITCHELL has never held a contractors license but has been found in violation for working without a license on a previous case. The Committee assessed a penalty of \$6,000 which was never paid.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

AURLIEAN MITCHELL is guilty of violating Section 17-25-505, as amended.


**ORDER**

The Committee voted unanimously that AURLIEAN MITCHELL shall pay a civil penalty of \$400 per day for 67 days of activity for a total of \$26,800 for violation of Section 17-25-505 payable to the Committee within twenty (20) days. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against AURLIEAN MITCHELL to prevent them from performing work in violation. AURLIEAN MITCHELL shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor

prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.

A hearing on the above captioned matter was held before the Arkansas Residential Contractors Committee on November 12, 2025, at the Committee's offices at 4100 Richards Road, North Little Rock, Arkansas.

Respondent, OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC was properly notified and did not appear. The Committee was represented by Jonathan Hutto, Attorney. Heidi Massey served as Hearing Officer. From testimony and other evidence presented the Committee makes the following findings of fact and conclusion of law.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC is licensed by the Residential Contractors Committee.
2. Our office received a complaint from Cheeming Cheong against Ozark Exteriors. Despite repeated requests to the address on file for the contractor, they failed or refused to respond to the allegations in the complaint.
3. Rule 17 CAR 295-112(b)(1) requires a licensed contractor to cooperate with an investigation and states that failure to do so can be considered misconduct in the contractor's business and result in the revocation of a contractors license

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC is guilty of violating Section 17-25-510(c), misconduct in the contractor's business.

**ORDER**

The Committee voted unanimously that the license of OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC is revoked for misconduct. The Committee further ordered that a cease and desist order be issued against OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC to prevent them from performing work in violation. OZARK EXTERIORS, LLC shall refrain from bidding on or performing work as a residential contractor prior to being licensed with the Residential Contractors Committee. You have the right to appeal this decision pursuant to the provisions of Ark. Code Ann. 17-25-511.
